### SECRETARY'S REPORT

Hello members. Welcome to another year and another newsletter. At the moment in early January its 15 degrees outside and has been in double figures for most of November and December. Daffodil bulbs have been in flower since early December at some locations in Crawley and I have primroses and snowdrops starting to bloom in my own garden. Whilst taking my dog for a walk early in the mornings the dawn chorus is clearly audible, and its early January, how our winters are changing.

It seems more than ever that we as gardeners especially have to adapt, and this is also something the society needs to do to survive and keep our members. As previously mentioned in newsletters and at our AGM we are starting to see a definite decline in people exhibiting and viewing at our shows and our group meetings are becoming difficult to self-finance, especially with the cost of a good speaker etc. There has been a decline in some shop sales. Once upon a time people used to queue for seed potatoes in the second week in January but over the last few years this has not been the case. Also our plant and bulb sales have struggled to meet costs.

So we have to adapt. Some thought has gone into how we can do this by looking at ways we can still provide a good service to our members, without sacrificing too much. Some of these changes will take place at our shows, but more of this from our Show Secretary.

Our groups are still trying to entertain those that come to meetings but we would still like to see more people attending. Not all meetings are on a specific horticultural topics; sometimes a guest speaker is giving a highly interesting talk on another entertaining subject.

Did you know that the Crawley Museum Society use our hall to give talks to its members which we as CHS members can attend for a small fee. They certainly had some very good speakers last year.

So that's where we are now. Make the most of your society and your gardening year. I hope that we have some really cold weather otherwise I can see the shop running out of slug pellets very quickly!!! Happy Gardening TREVOR

### **CHITTING POTATOES**

From 24 January seed potatoes will be in the CHS Shop and a list of the varieties it is hoped to be stocked is now available. For the benefit of new vegetable growers, here's how you get them going.

Chitting is simply another name for 'sprouting' or giving your spuds a kickstart. Some growers say this process should be done in the dark, e.g. in a cupboard or under the stairs while others advocate leaving them in a light but frost-free place. Personally, I prefer the latter because with the "in the dark" method if they are not checked regularly they could quickly develop long straggly shoots which may easily break off when planting out. I usually stand mine on a windowsill.

Whichever method you choose, stand the tubers with the buds or "eyes" upright in a seed tray or similar container – egg boxes are ideal. If there are eyes all over the tuber, choose the end with the most. Sprouting will take about six weeks during which time you should check them regularly rubbing out all but the 3 or 4 strongest shoots. I tend to give the tubers a light spray with water from time to time but they should be kept dryer rather than wet. They should be ready for planting out when the shoots are about one inch (2.5cm) long.

Planting time will vary according to the weather and soil conditions, especially for the first earlies. Folk lore suggests that you should not plant potatoes before Good Friday but as this can vary any time between mid March and the end of April, it is not a very practical guide. I would suggest that here in the South of England and subject to weather and soil conditions, mid to late March is about right for first earlies with other varieties spread throughout April for second earlies and May for your main crop.

When you go to the Shop you will see the different varieties for first early, second early and main crop listed for you to make your choice.

Happy New Year to you all.

Last year trading was a little down on the previous year, although I do my best to make sure our stock is competitively priced.

Last year Sinclair our compost supplier went into administration and Westland acquired Sinclair. Following a meeting with Westland regarding what they would supply, some Arthur Bowers stock will still be available, such as JAB Multipurpose, JAB with John Innes, JAB Ericaceous, JAB Top Soil, plus any stock we have in the compound. Westland don't supply JAB with John Innes, so we may have to find another supplier The Sinclair products still available are Sinclair All Purpose and Sinclair Potting composts.

On a brighter note, some prices are down but, unfortunately, a few will be slightly more.

Regarding insecticides and fungicides. The ongoing battle with the availability of reducing products will continue, but of course we will soldier on.

The onion sets and shallots will be in the shop on 17 January and seed potatoes will be in on 24 January.

Let us all be hopeful and look forward to a good gardening year. JOHN GREEN
